Two simple ideas regarding copyright:

- 1. application of the principle of *rule against inalienability* with respect of orphan works based on the notion that knowledge should never be made inalienable through lack of title but also that upon the presentation of proper title, it would be possible to reunite a work with its rightful creator, if one exists.
- 2. artwork passport proposal that every substantial artwork (one deemed to be within statutorally defined parameters) have a 'passport or title deed' without which it cannot be bought or sold and by means of which the details of current ownership may be recorded for the purposes, inter alia, of moral rights and resale rights.
